Attached is a list of wedding music approved for use at St. John's Church. Other music is possible, but it **MUST** be discussed with the organist. It is recommended that you select one or two pieces for the processional (one for the bridal party and another for the bride or one piece for all) and one piece for the recessional. If you have any preferences for the prelude music, please let the organist know; otherwise the organist will play four or five selections from the list for about 10 or 15 minutes before the service.

Hymns should be selected from the 1982 Hymnal which is in the pews. If hymns from another hymnal are requested, copies of the words and music (or just the words) should be provided to the congregation.

If there is to be a singer, several vocal solos which are particularly appropriate for weddings and which have been approved for use at St. John's are included on the list of wedding music. Again, other selections are possible, but these **MUST** be discussed with the organist. A copy of the music in the key in which the solo will be performed should be provided to the organist at least seven days before the wedding.

Soloists and other instrumentalists, such as brass or string players, may be arranged by the couple or in conjunction with the organist. This should be done well in advance of the wedding to insure their availability. These musicians set their own fees which should be discussed with the couple directly.

If a vocal or instrumental solo is desired, these musical selections are ordinarily performed during the prelude.

In selecting music, please remember that this is a church service. Music from Broadway musicals or from operas is usually not permitted at St. John's.

The organist's fee for weddings is \$250. There is an additional \$50 fee if the organist is asked to accompany soloists or instrumentalists. If the couple wishes to have the organist attend the wedding rehearsal, there is also an additional \$50 fee.
